

Design enthusiasts will appreciate the subtle theatricality embedded throughout: multiple fire features—including one in the primary suite—bring a sculptural warmth to

each space. A customizable wine wall adds a bespoke layer of sophistication, inviting

personalization while maintaining the architectural integrity of the home.

But the true genius lies in the layout. Each room is oriented to capture distinct views and light patterns, encouraging residents to experience the desert's ever-changing palette throughout the day. Whether it's the city lights from the primary suite or the sun setting behind Camelback's ridgeline from the terrace, the home's design is deeply rooted in place.

As the final phase of the Ascent at The Phoenician® development, Summit represents a bold design milestone for Scottsdale. It's also Olson Kundig's first residential condominium project in Arizona, bringing their internationally lauded approach to a new audience.
